Lyrics

All shall be well, and all shall be well,

And all manner of things shall be well.

Signs

All Flat hand, palm down, sweeps around.	Well Both flat hands move from chest down & forward, then 'thumbs up'.
Manner, kinds of Both hands, indexes pointing forwards, move up and down alternately while moving apart.	Thing Both hands, indexes pointing up. Indexes make small circle & tap knuckles x2.

Ideas for use in school

A *Sam button singer can start the round and sing the whole of the song (maybe several times through), with the other voice parts coming in as normal.

You could record a simple accompaniment onto the Sam button e.g.

Bm A Bm
All shall be well, and

Bm A Bm
all shall be well, and

Bm A Bm
all manner of things shall be

Bm A Bm
well.

A Sam button singer could lead a group of singers, helping them to keep on their parts. If s/he is leading a group, you might try recording a 'ramp' so everyone comes in at the same time e.g. Record the count in '1,2,3,and – All shall be well,' &c.

This beautiful song can be sung slowly, giving time for everyone to make the signs.

You can sing it in two, three or four parts.

*Sam (song/speech/sound and music) button – this is what I call the voice output communication devices like Step by Step, BigMac, 4Talk4 etc.
